Kia ora koutou - and welcome back to school for 2024. What an awesome start to the week we have had so far. I trust you all enjoyed the holiday period, especially the sunshine. I have had lots of chats in classrooms and in the playground about the fun things the kids have done over the holidays, from exciting holidays abroad or in holiday spots around NZ, to those that have enjoyed some down time relaxing at home. I enjoyed the long weekend back up in our holiday spot in Mangawhai - I think the kids will all be pleased to know that even Principals enjoy a good water slide with their friends from time to time.....



Now we're officially back down to business here at school, I have a few things to update you on, as well as some important dates for your calendars. Firstly, we are having a **Powhiri next Wednesday (7th Feb)** to welcome all our new staff, students and families. We also realise this fell away somewhat in 2023, and if you are a family who missed this special welcome last year we would love for you to come and be a part of our Powhiri next Wednesday as well. We ask new families to meet Mrs Glover at the flagpole at 10:30am, ready for a 10:40am start. This will be followed by a shared Morning Tea in the Hall for all adults as well.

Next on the list, we have three Teacher Only Days set for this year:

- Friday 31st May (Friday before King's Birthday) Curriculum focus
- Monday 1st July Rosehill Pathways Kāhui Ako Mega-Conference (all 13 schools in our Community of Learning together)
- Friday 25th October (Friday before Labour Weekend)

Also, we have our first set of Learner Led Conferences coming up in Week 6 of this term (Wednesday 6th of March). While the name remains the same, the purpose and structure has changed in response to the feedback we received through our community consultation process late last year. We will be going back to booking single slots where the student, teacher and whānau can all meet together to focus on setting learning goals together (without other families in classrooms at the same time). More information will come out closer to the time but for now, book in the date as it will be an early finish to school that day to accommodate all families getting their time slot.

Another important change for 2024, is that our school policy around birthday treats being brought to school has been updated. From the start of this year, we are asking that no treats of any kind (be they food/cake related or otherwise), be brought to school for a child's birthday. Many schools have adopted this policy and we feel it makes sense to do the same at Karaka. We will of course celebrate birthdays with our Birthday Board, being sung to in class (only if the student would like that of course - not all students do), and making it as special as we can. However, bringing sugary treats to share doesn't really fit with a 'healthy eating' philosophy, nor does it promote inclusion when someone brings something that is not enough for everyone in the class. We feel it is much more sensible to move away from material/edible treats altogether.

Please help support this new policy - you will find that if you do send something to school, that it ends up being returned home again at the end of the day.



Last on the update list is the school pool... which I'm afraid is almost up and running but I haven't been able to sign it off just yet. We have had a hiccup with the application of the paint around two of the four edges of the pool; this is being rectified later this week. Once this paint has had time to cure, we can then go ahead and fill the pool. We hope to have it up and running for the start of Week 3, so bare with us.

In the meantime, we are planning some water slide fun at lunchtimes for each team next week to escape the heat so check for this info on HERO (and now you'll see the link to my photo above!).

### Start of the Year Information from the Office:

- Our bus bell goes at 2.35pm when bus children are released to go to bus lines. Children **MUST** be signed out even if you are picking them up early on the bus bell for an appointment.
- **Arriving at School**: The first bell for the day is at 8.15am. Prior to this children are not actively supervised therefore must wait alongside the Hall under the shelter (next to the top flat). Students are expected to stay here until the first bell and then are welcome to head to their classrooms.
- **Assemblies:** Occur every fortnight. They will be held on the Friday of even weeks with the first assembly being 9th February at 1.45pm. Parents/Whanau are welcome to attend school assemblies.
- School Accounts: You can view accounts on Kindo. Please sign up to this as soon as possible. Please see instructions in this newsletter.
- Please note that **there is a discount of \$25.00 for school donations that are paid by the end of Term 1.** If you need to arrange a payment plan please see us in the office.
- Out of Bounds Area: For reasons of safety we would like all children and parents to enter and exit the school past the main office. Please do not park in the staff car park beside the sensory garden.

- Absences: If for any reason on a given day, your child will not be attending school, please make a phone call to the school office before 9.30am OR send an absence through our student management system Hero OR email the office. You can also send a notice via the Karaka School website so that we know your child will not be at school and is safe. Calls are made to the parent/guardian by 9.30am if there is an unexplained absence.
- Sun Safe: Karaka School Safe Sun Policy states that during Term 1 & 4 children are required to have a suitable hat that gives protection to the face, ears and neck. We strongly suggest that our official school hat is the most suitable for this. Hats are in stock. These are sold in the uniform shop (Open Monday 8.15-9.00am) for \$15.00.
- School Banking: We will be continuing with ASB School Banking. School banking day is Thursday. A secure box is located in the office on the outside wall of the sickbay (enter through the rear door to place in the box). All deposits are taken to the bank on Friday. To set up an account please go into your local ASB branch.
- School Bus Travel: Parents are reminded that the school bus service runs under strict rules and regulations for health and safety reasons. If your child travels by bus you should have already viewed and signed a bus transport contract with the school. If in doubt, please check with the office. If you are picking your child up after school and have not advised the office in advance please ensure that the teacher on bus duty is informed.
- Bus Fees: Bus fees (if applicable) must be received within the first two weeks of each term. There is a flat fee of \$50.00 per term per child, regardless of whether they travel one or both ways.
- School Car Parks: Please take care when using our school car park and our drop off/pick up bay. The most important rule is to use your common sense. Please do not leave your car in the bus bay or drop off area! Cars parked here, should have drivers in them at all times! Our buses do not always arrive at the same time. Remember, this is a "pick up and drop off area" only. Please use the central walkway if you park in the middle of the carpark. DO NOT walk your children through the carpark behind the parked cars.
